

Cryotherapy

Cryotherapy is the treatment of skin abnormalities by freezing.

The skin is frozen briefly with a very cold substance called liquid nitrogen. This is usually applied to the skin using a spray gun, but a cotton bud can sometimes be used instead. This is usually done during a visit to the outpatient clinic. The procedure lasts a matter of seconds and is sometimes repeated after the skin has thawed out.

The treatment causes a cold burn and the skin will feel sore during and after the treatment. The skin will become red and swollen afterwards. If the area is very painful after treatment paracetamol may help. You can wash as normal and then just pat the area gently dry.

You may develop a water or blood filled blister. This may be left intact and will gradually settle (only if a blister was very uncomfortable would it be necessary to puncture it using a sterile needle and then cover the area with a dry dressing or sticking plaster for a few days).

After a few days the area may begin to crust or scale. The crust or scale will gradually fall off and this will take a further week or so. It is important not to pick at the scab at this stage as this will encourage scarring. Occasionally, cryotherapy can leave a slight scar or an area of decreased or increased pigmentation afterwards.

Vaseline can be gently rubbed in to the scab if necessary. Do not apply any other preparation to the area within a week of treatment unless instructed by your doctor.
