MEG 20/18 Apologies

MEG 21/18 Minutes from Previous Meeting

The minutes from the previous meeting held on 18 April 2018 were agreed as a correct record. The updated log was NOTED.

MEG 22/18 Membership Report

The Membership and Engagement Manager advised that recruitment of new members continued and although 56 members had been recruited during the three months July to September, 108 had been lost during the same timeframe which had resulted in an overall decrease of 52 members. 42 of the 108 lost were due to members dying and 51 of the 108 were members who had decided to opt out in response to the GDPR information being circulated by the Membership and Engagement Manager; this being a legal requirement.

The Membership and Engagement Manager highlighted the members' events that had taken place which had been extremely popular especially the Annual Members' Meeting.

Finally, the recruitment exercise that coincided with the NHS 70th anniversary had been very positive. New members had been recruited and many application forms handed out. The Membership and Engagement Manager added that Danny Sparkes had continued handing out application forms in her spare time and several of these had been returned completed. At Lilly Evans' request the Membership and Engagement Manager agreed to provide her with some application forms.

23/18** **Membership Action Plan**

The Membership and Engagement Manager advised that all actions were up to date or in the process of being actioned.

The Membership and Engagement Manager highlighted that communications from members had reduced during August and September and this was due to less communications being sent to them. Things were now picking up again due to messages being shared regarding the Governor elections.

The Membership and Engagement Manager highlighted that attendance from members at the last Council meeting had improved with five members attending. Attendance from members of the public at Trust Board remained consistent.

The Membership and Engagement Manager advised that proposed events for the future included Dementia and Urology. With Urology it had been decided that this would take place after March as the service would have undergone some further changes.

Lilly Evans highlighted the lack of information women were provided in relation to HRT, Osteoporosis and Thyroid conditions. The Group considered a members' event covering these areas would be useful and that an Endocrinologist, Gynaecologist and Rheumatologist could be invited to take part. It was also considered a similar event for health issues mainly associated with men should take place.

Lilly wondered if information could be shared about the services moving over to GPs and other primary care providers. The Group discussed potential organised visits to departments after the building works had been completed and to coincide with the Annual Members' Meeting. Another area that was considered members needed to be provided information on was in relation to the Integrated Care Partnership. Lilly added that this information should also be displayed in public facilities, for example public libraries.

The Membership and Engagement Manager agreed to take these suggestions forward.

Council of Governors' Election Update

The Membership and Engagement Manager advised that there had been a good interest in the elections particularly in the constituency of Runnymede, Surrey Heath, Windsor and Maidenhead and the staff category of Volunteers. The constituencies of Elmbridge and staff - administrative and clerical had seen less interest.

Lilly Evans was aware that a number of GPs had retired in the area whilst relatively young and considered they should be approached when future Governor elections were to take place. How they could be contacted was discussed and Lilly suggested she may be able to make contact. The possibility of tackling retired non-executive directors was mooted and considered a good idea.

The Membership and Engagement Manager advised that due to the number of Governors coming to the end of their term in November 2019 publicity campaigns would begin earlier in the year and members would be invited to shadow existing Governors to get a feel for what the role entailed. The Membership and Engagement Manager suggested that Governors should take a key role at members' events and a segment included which highlighted the Governor role and how interested members could buddy up with existing Governors should they be interested.

MEG 30/18 Apologies

MEG 31/18 Minutes from Previous Meeting

The minutes from the previous meeting held on 3 October 2018 were agreed as a correct record. The updated log was NOTED.

MEG 32/18 Membership Interim Update

The Membership and Engagement Manager advised that membership numbers remained constant since a similar number of members had been recruited to replace lost members.

The Membership and Engagement Manager advised Group members of the recently finalised members' event on Dementia taking place on 28 May 2019 as well as an additional study day taking place on 19 September 2019. It was advised that arranging further events would be the primary focus over the next few months. Amongst these were the Urology and A&E events that had been postponed. The Group discussed the possibility of having a Diabetes event and whether Dr Mike Baxter, Non-Executive Director could have a segment due his expertise in this field.

Bhagat Singh Rupal queried whether any of the events would be taking place at Ashford and it was advised that as well as the Annual Members' Meeting taking place at Ashford in 2019 there was potential to hold more events at Ashford due to the availability of a venue. Staff would need to have capacity to travel across to Ashford on top of their clinical day to allow this.

Finally, the Membership and Engagement Manager requested assistance from

Governors to man a recruitment stand in the Main Entrance at St Peter's on Wednesday 19 December.

MEG 33/18 Membership Action Plan

The Membership and Engagement Manager advised that all actions were up to date or in the process of being actioned. The action plan would be refreshed in time for the next meeting.

MEG 34/18 Fundraising – Charity Ambassadors

The Fundraising Manager introduced herself to the Group and advised she had been post since January 2018. Previously she had worked for Hampshire Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust. The Fundraising Manager advised that she had come along to explain how fundraising should work and the robust procedures in place.

The Fundraising Manager advised there were three projects she was working on. One of these was the electronic surveillance system for Paediatrics. Monitors would feed back to a central screen on the nurses' desk, alerting staff to any change in a child's condition, for example a rise in temperature. Of the £80K, £22K had been raised.

The Fundraising Manager mentioned a projector for senior adults (no longer referred to as the Elderly) which projected interactive games and quizzes onto a large table. This would be especially useful for patients with dementia. £2K of the £7K had been raised.

The Fundraising Manager advised that she worked a four day week and that covering the Trust's catchment area was challenging. A solution to this would be to recruit fundraising ambassadors to help provide the link with organisations in the community. The role had flexibility for an individual to do as much or as little as their time permitted. The Fundraising Manager welcomed the views of the Group.

Bhagat Singh Rupal and Simon Bhadye considered it was a great initiative. Simon provided some background information on his personal endeavours raising funds for charity. He advised he would be happy to help with any projects which benefitted his local community. Simon also mentioned that the President of Spelthorne Rotary Club was struggling to get someone from the Trust to come and receive a cheque for the Stroke Unit. The Fundraising Manager asked Simon to pass on her details advising that she would help coordinate an appropriate person to receive the cheque.

The Fundraising Manager mentioned that there would be a fundraising appeal in 2019 to support the expansion of the Infusion Suite once it was transferred to Wordsworth Ward. Plans included creating a more holistic unit with additional facilities.

Group members agreed to share the ambassador role with their friends and relatives.

The Group discussed ideas for raising money. It was suggested that the

Fundraising Manager came along to the Council meeting in March 2019.
